Secondary School Applications for Year 6 Pupils

Dear Year 6 Parents/Carers

Your Secondary School application form for your Year 6 child should be completed by logging onto: www.eadmissions.org.uk

Redbridge has translated all of the relevant information and guidance into different languages on their website to help you to complete your online application form.

Then:

- 1) Click on the accessibility button in the top right hand corner of the screen
- 2) Click on the translation icon
- 3) Select a language from the drop down menu
- 4) Watch the step by step tutorial explaining how to use the service which is delivered in the language of your choice.

Please note that proof of residency must be submitted with your application.

An <u>additional SIF form</u> must also be completed if applying for Faith schools or own admission authority schools.

The deadline for submission of all applications, supporting documents and SIF forms is the 31st October.

If you are unable to attach your supporting documents whilst making your application, please email electronic copies of proof of residency to:

Black History Month

October marks Black History Month — a special time when we celebrate the achievements, culture and contributions of Black people, both historically and today. This year, the national theme is "Standing Firm in Power and Pride", highlighting resilience, leadership, identity and the enduring strength of Black communities.

At Cranbrook we embraced this theme by encouraging our pupils to learn about Black heritage, stories of leadership and community change. We looked at the way power and pride have helped shape our shared history, exploring what it means to stand firm — to hold strong to our values, our voices and our right to belong — and to celebrate pride in who we are, where we come from, and what we can become.

We enjoyed creating opportunities for our children, across all year groups, to engage in activities, reflections and discussions that connected to this theme and our school values of respect, belonging and aspiration.

We believe it's not just during October that we should honour and learn from Black history — this month gives us a focused moment, but our commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion continues all year round.

ATTENDANCE UPDATES

The Department for Education (DfE) has introduced new guidance for managing attendance, including a national framework for penalty notices. These changes take effect from 19 August 2024. At Cranbrook Primary School, we adhere to the Redbridge Attendance Strategy and Code of Conduct.

Please be aware of the following key points:

Fixed Penalty Notices can be issued when a student has: 1.5 Consecutive days of term time leave

2.10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period First Offence:

The first time a Penalty notice is issued for Term Time Leave of Irregular attendance the amount will be

- £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (Within 3 years):

• The second time a penalty notice is issued for Term Time Leave of Irregular Attendance the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years):

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented to the Magistrates' Court. Fines can be up to £2,500 per parent, per child.


Parents/carers please note the gates close at 9am promptly, if you are late, your child will need to be brought in late

Absence: Examples of Proof required

- A medical appointment card with details of the appointment.
- A letter from a professional, such as a hospital consultant or psychologist.
- Proof of a consultation with NHS 111.
- A prescription or medication prescribed by a GP.
- A copy of the prescription.
- A screenshot of a medical note (e.g., via the NHS) app).
- Letters confirming hospital appointments.
- A slip from the surgery with the date, the pupil's name, and the surgery stamp, signed by the receptionist.
