Evesight and Dental check-ups: Is your child complaining of headaches and eye strain. Did you know eye tests are FREE under the NHS for children under sixteen, as well as those aged 16-18 in full time education. Children in these groups will also get a voucher towards the cost of a pair of spectacles. We advise all parents to get yearly check-ups to avoid any long term medical concerns.

NHS dental care for children is free. Take your child to the dentist when their first milk teeth appear. This is so they become familiar with the environment and get to know the dentist. The dentist can advise you on how to prevent decay and identify any oral health problems at an early stage. Dental check-ups should be done every six months.
