Parent Governor Elections: We currently have a vacancy for a parent governor. All parents who do not work at the school are eligible to apply. This role is voluntary and strategic and a firm commitment is required. You must attend two evening meetings, two day time committee meetings and one monitoring visit every term. A nomination form and the code of conduct for governors is available on our website:

www.cranbrookprimaryschool.com under the section governors'. Each nomination must be proposed and seconded by parents/guardians of a child currently on roll at this school. A husband/wife/partner cannot propose or second their own husband/wife or partner. The parent nominated should also supply a brief statement of not more than 100 words in support of his/her candidature. If there are more than two nominations, then a ballot will take place. Please return nominations to the school office marked' clerk to the governors' by 4pm on Wednesday 15th November 2023 (any nominations received after this date will be invalid). Please note that the successful candidate will be subject to an enhanced DBS clearance.

In line with electoral guidance, the use of social media including WhatsApp is **not** permitted for the canvassing of candidates during elections. Candidates standing for election will be disqualified if any canvassing takes place on social media and/or WhatsApp by the candidates, friends or relatives.



#### **Palestine and Israel Conflict**

The increased time and level of violence continues to impact the lives of Palestinians and Israelis. Graphic scenes of death and destruction are on television and social media. During this extremely difficult time, I ask that we continue to support humanitarian efforts to help. Discussions around the conflict can be very emotionally charged and heart-breaking. I ask that you please keep in mind that our children listen to and pick up conversations and emotions and can easily internalise what they hear and see. This may be difficult for them to understand (more so for our very young children). Please reassure them about their safety and give them time to talk about what they understand and feel. Older children may have stronger views and it is essential that you allow them to voice their views at home and assist with any misinformation or misconceptions. Please discourage children from talking about which 'side' you are on. We hold the stance that we are on the side of humanity and that war and violence are terrible. We will support your child should you feel that there is a need and as always we will support our families.

#### World Science Day-Friday 24th of November 2023

Friday 24th November 2023 is World Science Day and this year's theme is Trust in Science. Trust in science is vital for developing evidence-based solutions to global challenges and finding cures to diseases to save lives. Have a chat with your family about how we could improve our trust in science.

The CFA Movie Night will take place on **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> November**. Movie Night is a fun after school event for pupils from Reception – Year 6. #### <u>Celebrating Cultural Connections-Celebrating</u> <u>diversity across our school:</u>

Maya Angelou born Marguerite Annie Johnson; April 4, 1928 – May 28, 2014) was an American memoirist, poet, and civil rights activist. She published seven autobiographies, three books of essays, several books of poetry, and is credited with a list of plays, movies, and television shows spanning over 50 years. She received dozens of awards and more than 50 honorary degrees. Angelou's series of seven autobiographies focus on her childhood and early adult experiences. The first, *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings* (1969), tells of her life up to the age of 17 and brought her international recognition and acclaim.
